1. He was dedicated.

- a. He left all that he had to follow the man of God!
 - i. His parents and possessions 20 And he left the oxen, and ran after Elijah, and said, Let me, I pray thee, kiss my father and my mother, and then I will follow

thee. And he said unto him, Go back again: for what have I done to thee?

- ii. He was rich. His family owned 12 yoke of oxen.
- iii. Leaving all this is a mark of complete surrender

iv. This was complete surrender to the will of God for his life

- b. Not only did he leave it, he burned it. He was totally
 - sold out. 2 10
 - i. He killed the oxen
 - ii. He burned his plow
 iii. He made an open, public decision
 - iv. He had no escape route planned
 - v. He burned his bridges 21 And he returned back from

him, and took a yoke of oxen, and **slew them,** and

- c. Nothing or no one could make him turn back
 - i. Not his parents and family 20 And **he left the oxen**, and ran after Elijah, and said, Let me, I pray thee, kiss

my father and my mother, and *then* I will follow thee. And he said unto him, Go back again: for what have I done to thee?

So they came to Jericho. iv. 2:6 And Elijah said unto him, **Tarry, I pray** thee, here; for the Lord hath sent me to Jordan. they two went on.

- 2. He was diligent. He paid the price to serve!
 - a. He had a spirit of humility, he left his riches to serve the man of God
 - i. He had 12 yoke of oxen 19:19 So he departed thence, and found Elisha the son of Shaphat, who was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen before him, and he with the twelfth: and Elijah passed by him, and cast his mantle upon him.
 - ii. He was used to being in charge
 - iii. Now he leaves not for some great position or popularity but to serve the man of God
 - iv. He ministered to Elijah 21 And he returned back from him, and took a yoke of oxen, and slew them, and boiled their flesh with the instruments of the oxen, and gave unto the people, and they did eat. Then he arose, and went after Elijah, and ministered unto him.
 - v. He poured water on his hands II Kings 3:11 But Jehoshaphat said, *Is there* not here a prophet of the Lord, that we may inquire of the Lord by him? And one of the king of Israel's servants answered and said, Here

is Elisha the son of Shaphat, which poured water on the hands of Elijah.

b. He yielded or gave his life to be a servant not a leader 21
And he returned back from him, and took a yoke of oxen, and slew them, and boiled their flesh with the instruments of the oxen, and gave unto the people, and they did eat. Then he arose, and went after Elijah, and ministered unto him.

3. He was a disciple or learner

a. He stuck to the man of God no matter what the difficulty
 II Kings 2:1 And it came to pass, when the Lord would
 take up Elijah into heaven by a whirlwind, that Elijah

went with Elisha from Gilgal.

- b. He was hungry for God, His will, His presence
- c. You will have to humble yourself to be trained.
- d. You will have to do jobs that you consider beneath you
- e. A disciple is under the teaching and discipline of another
- 4. He was desirous

- a. He had a burning desire to do something for God 20 And he left the oxen, and **ran after Elijah**, and said, Let me, I pray thee, kiss my father and my mother, and *then* I will follow thee. And he said unto him, Go back again: for what have I done to thee?
- b. He was hungry for the power of God II Kings 2:9 And it came to pass, when they were gone over, that Elijah said unto Elisha, Ask what I shall do for thee, before I be taken away from thee. And Elisha said, I pray thee, let a **double portion of thy spirit be upon**

me.

c. It was obvious that he had the power of God on his life II Kings 2:15 And when the sons of the prophets which were to view at Jericho saw him, they said, The spirit of Elijah doth rest on Elisha. And they came to meet him, and bowed themselves to the ground before him.
